5. Did your parents always live in Missouri? If so, tell about their experiences in living here.
6. If your parents or grandparents moved to Missouri at some point, tell about their experience in moving here:
 - a. What caused them to decide to move to Missouri?
 - b. What were their experiences in moving here?
 - c. Were they accepted by the local residents? If not, why, and were they able to overcome this?
 - d. When did they move to Missouri? Where did they settle?
 - e. What did your parents do for work to support the family?
 - f. What was their religious denomination? Did this change over time?
7. Where did you first live?

8. How did your family find your permanent home? Describe the home in detail including where it was located. Did you rent it or purchase it? Describe the process of acquiring it in detail, including the cost and any special preparations you had to make in order to move in (i.e. repairs, improvements, modifications, etc.) Who owned the home before/when you moved in? What were they like?
9. Describe the community in which you first lived. How were you received? Who were your first friends in the community? Tell us about them in detail.
10. Where did you shop? Describe the businesses you frequented and tell where they were located. What made you choose those particular stores?
11. If you lived in more than one locality in Missouri, tell about the following for each location you resided:
 - a. What caused you to move there?
 - b. Did you stay in the same community but move to a different residence? If so, describe:
 - i. How your life changed by making his move.
 - ii. Did you remain friends with those with whom you previously associated?
 - iii. Did the move help you or hinder you in any way?
 - c. If you changed which community you lived in, describe the new community you moved to.
 - i. How were you received? Who were your first friends in the community?
 - ii. Where did you shop? Describe the businesses you frequented and tell where they were located. What made you choose those particular stores?
 - iii. How did your life change by making this move?
 - iv. Did you remain friends with those with whom you previously associated?
12. Have you ever felt that you have a “mission” in being in Missouri or a mission to a particular part of Missouri? If so, what was that mission?
 - a. How did you embark upon it?
 - b. Has it gone the way you thought it would? Why or why not?
 - c. If you feel you had several missions or that your mission changed throughout the time you lived in Missouri, please describe the additional missions, and how you knew the mission had changed for you.
 - d. Please share anything about your personal missions that you feel comfortable sharing such as who else was involved, what kinds of spiritual direction did you receive, and how you followed that direction.

13. For each unit of the church congregations you attended, please write about the following:
 - a. Describe the congregation you attended. Was it a large or small congregation? Did your congregation belong to a larger organization? Who were the key local church leaders?
 - b. How were you received by the members of your congregation?
 - c. Tell about your experiences in attending church.
 - d. What callings or church responsibilities did you have? Who did you serve with?
 - e. What challenges did your congregation have? How did the members respond to these challenges? How did the local church leaders respond to them?
 - f. Tell about some of the positive experiences you had in this congregation. Describe them in detail and tell who was involved.

14. Can you share a little about in home visits you made to others or others made to you? Share at least one or two key experiences that you remember having with in-home visits and where you had them.

15. How were the members of your church received by the community when they moved here from other places? If you lived in several locations, did this reception differ from place to place?
 - a. Were there any challenges to overcome in building bridges between the members of your church and the community? If so, tell about them in detail, and if they were resolved, how they were resolved.
 - b. Were there common projects or joint efforts between your church and other churches in the community? If so, please describe these in detail including how they came about, what the effort was, who the key people were, and what the outcome was.

16. Tell about other churches in the area. Were they friendly with one another? Were there any churches they did not like or tolerate? How did you build relationships with the members of other faiths?

17. How did you support your family? Did you have to commute or were you able to work locally? Tell about the process of finding/obtaining work. Was it a different experience than you had in other localities prior to living in Missouri? In what ways did it differ?

18. Tell about your occupation(s) and the company(ies)/organization(s) you worked for. If you had several occupations, tell what caused you to change jobs. Which was your favorite job, and why?

19. Did you or your family experience any financial hardships? If so, what happened? How did you get by? How long did the challenges last? How did you overcome them?

20. Did you or your family experience any personal challenges such as transportation issues, culture shock, isolation, health issues, or consistent trials? How did these challenges impact your lives? How were you able to overcome them or learn to cope with them?
21. Did others in your circle of friends/family have challenges? What were some of the hardest ones? How did you support one another through your challenges?
22. Tell about your community involvement. What organizations did you belong to or provide service to or through? Tell about some of the key people involved and some of the key projects undertaken.
23. What was the condition of the town you lived in? Was it undergoing renovation or did it need to? In what ways? Who was responsible for helping to improve it? Did their efforts succeed?
24. Tell about the local government. What kind of government was in place? Who were some of the key leaders? Did you participate in government? What were your experiences with voting or serving in government positions? Did you attend public meetings? Tell about a few of them.
25. Were there any major projects undertaken in the community? What were they? Who was involved? How did they turn out?
26. How did you feel about living near some of the local historical sites? Did you have any favorites? Why did you like to/not like to visit them? Did you have any special or spiritual experiences at any of these sites? Please describe them in detail, if you feel you can. How did these experiences change your life?
27. How has the community/culture of the area changed over time? Who has been instrumental in changing it? Describe this in detail.
28. Have you seen any change in how the descendants of the early Mormons are received in the area? In what ways has this changed? To what do you attribute any change?
29. Have you had any missionary experiences while living in Missouri? If so, please describe them and what the outcome was.
30. Have your children/grandchildren remained in the area? Why or why not?
31. How do you feel your life has been changed by your experience of being in Missouri?
32. Have you met others who have had similar experiences in Missouri to yours? Who are they? What have their experiences been like?

33. If you found out someone was feeling inspired to move to Missouri, what advice would you have for them? Would you assist them with the move/transition? In what ways?
34. Do you have plans to leave Missouri – or have you left Missouri at any point? Under what conditions would you/did you leave?
35. If you left Missouri or plan to, have you returned or do you desire to return? Under what conditions did you/would you return? Did you or would you return to the same area of Missouri? Why or why not?
36. As you have lived in Missouri, have you been cognizant of the need to prepare yourself and your family for the future establishment of Zion? What have been your experiences in this realm, if any?
37. If there is anything else you would like to say about your experience in Missouri, please feel free to do so in as much detail as you would like. Remember that the information you share will help future historians to piece together the history of the Latter-day Saints returning to Missouri in the Latter-days and the efforts they made and experiences they had in preparing for the Second Coming of the Savior.
